Her 5 sisters also received various advanced degrees, and all were encouraged by their father to pursue their dreams. Masooma and her sisters were working with USAID when the U.S. pulled out of Afghanistan.

Their father died of COVID. which was a tremendous loss for them. They knew they were at risk, so decided to leave. They made 2 attempts, finally leaving everything behind except for some documents tied around their waist and one small backpack. When they boarded the plane, they were not even told where they were going. They landed first in Qatar, staying in a giant tent with hundreds of people, then onto Germany, then to New Jersey and then to San Diego, where they now live.

Her sisters are not yet employed, but Masooma is working at La Maestra Community Health Centers. She said: "IF there is stress, stay thankful. If there is homesickness, stay hopeful."

Thank you, Masooma, for sharing so much of your journey with us.
