Cricket Initiative

In 2019 the first Quadrangle Cricket initiative was introduced in the four (4) primary schools located in the Maraval area, namely La Seiva R.C., Boissierre R.C., Maraval R.C. and Paramin R.C. The anticipation of continuing this initiative was high but the pandemic stymied all hopes of continuance. However, on the insistence of the Principals of the said schools, PP and Chair of Service projects Ms. Mary Charles was able to restart the project in 2024 with one hundred (100) students who were selected to participate in the ten-week initiative.

The programme was launched in February 2024 by Mr. Brian Glasgow the then District





Governor of Rotary District 7030, comprising several Caribbean countries as part of his visit to Trinidad and Tobago. In his feature address DG Brian encouraged the students to take advantage of such a programme which would enable them to be the future stars of West Indies cricket. Other attendees included Mr. Wesley Dookhoo of the Ministry of Education who pledged the support of the Ministry for this initiative to ensure its sustainability, and Mr. Devindra Maharaj, Coordinator, who provided an overview of the programme and suggested that such a programme should be offered to schools in other areas.

The competitions among the four (4) schools began in May and concluded in July 2024 with the finals among the schools. A closing ceremony was held to present prizes to the winning school and to individual students whose performances were outstanding.

The Principals and students expressed their excitement with this initiative especially in terms of the positive impact of this sport on the students' self-confidence and self-esteem. The Club has therefore given the undertaking to sustain this initiative.
