On Friday 3rd July, 2020, the Rotary Club of Maraval (RCoM), through the kind sponsorship of the PeopleBridge Charitable Foundation and in partnership with Smith Robertson & Company Limited, donated feminine hygiene products for one hundred and fifty (150) female inmates at Trinidad and Tobago Prison Service.

The donation was received on behalf of the female inmates by the Commissioner of Prison, Mr. Dennis Pulchan, the Deputy Commissioner of Prison in the Programmes and Industry Department, Mr. Deopersad Ramoutar and Senior Superintendent of Prison in the Programmes and

Industry Department, Mr. Patrick King at the Trinidad and Tobago Prison Service Headquarters on Phillips Street, Port of Spain.

Mr. Pulchan expressed his heartfelt appreciation for the kind donation and acknowledged RCoM's long-standing relationship with the Trinidad and Tobago Prison Service. He made special mention of the RCoM's Past President Marie Dalton-Brown who has pioneered free eye testing and eye wear programme for the inmates at the Maximum Security Prison for twenty (20) years.



Rotary District Covid-19 Fundraiser-Rotary District 7030 pins



In July 2020, our Rotary District 7030 spearheaded a fundraiser initiative to assist with District wide COVID-19 relief through the sale of newly designed District pins. The design of the pin embodies the warmth of our Caribbean Rotary District comprising Rotary, Rotaract and Interact with the colours representing the unity of the Rotary organization.

Our Club supported this initiative with the purchase of twenty-two (22) pins.

Partnering with India's Rotary Club of Secunderabad West's Global Grant

The Rotary Club of Maraval joined with six (6) other Rotary Clubs based in USA and Italy to assist the Rotary Club of Secunderabad West of Rotary District 3150 in India with their global grant project which focused on the following:

- 1) Transformation of 181 Government schools into 'Happy Schools'. This project is targeted at providing essential infrastructure to Government schools that are poorly outfitted.
- 2) A Mobile Cancer Detection Bus. This will be used to help detect the early stages of cancer in rural villages and so reduce the mortality rate of those afflicted persons. With the use of the bus, the entire rural population of Telangana / Andhra states in India can be covered over a period of 2 to 3 years.

Our Club was pleased to assist the Rotary Club of Securandabad West, India, in its efforts to provide critical assistance to those in need in their provinces.
