Rotary Club of Maraval presents 82 tablets to Five Primary Schools









It is said that it takes a village to raise a child and this philosophy guided the recent presentation made by the Rotary Club of Maraval (RCoM) on International Children's Day. Through a grant received from the Rotary District 7030, part funding from the PeopleBridge Charitable Foundation and the generosity of one of the Rotary Club's long standing members, Susan Hale and family, a donation was made of eighty-two (82) tablets to five (5) Primary Schools in the Maraval and Rampanalgas areas. The club was also significantly assisted through its partnership with Fairway Freight Consolidators Inc., Caribbean Airlines Cargo and Ramp Logistics to ship and clear the devices.

Receiving the devices on behalf of their students were the Principals of each of the five (5) schools; Our Lady of Assumption, Boissiere RC School, La Sieva RC School, Maraval RC School, Paramin RC School and Rampanalgas RC School.

Mr. Camillius Olivier, Principal of Paramin RC School, expressed his sincere thanks on behalf of the Principals and schools present. He said that, "These devices will go a long way in bringing much needed assistance to those students who did not have these resources available to them, and we thank the Rotary Club of Maraval for answering the call for assistance."

President of the Rotary Club, Giselle Holder and the Club's Past President and Service Projects Chair, Mary Charles also expressed their heartfelt joy on behalf of the Rotary Club of Maraval and its sponsors, in being able to get these much needed devices to the students. Ms. Holder said that, "It remains the priority of the Rotary Club of Maraval to continue deepening our relationships with the five schools assisted today and also with those in need in our community. We will continue our focus on and commitment to addressing the specific needs of our community as best as we can."

The Rotary Club of Maraval remains steadfast in helping those in need through literacy and education initiatives, peace and conflict resolution sessions and overall community outreach programmes and projects.

RCOM receives District 7030 grant for the upgrade of Boissiere RC School Library

The Rotary Club of Maraval has been awarded a 2020-21 Rotary District 7030 grant in response to our proposal submitted for the upgrade and outfitting of the Boissiere RC School's library. This is in keeping with our Club's focus to provide improved opportunities for basic education and literacy initiatives in the Maraval Community.

With this grant, it is our hope that we will be able to improve student literacy and enhance Secondary Entrance Assessment (S.E.A) performance. Indeed, with this new and comfortable space the 140 students of Boissiere R.C. Primary School will be encouraged to develop a love for reading by going on their own to the library, and so create a learning environment that is conducive to furthering their education.

Similar to what was done at the La Seiva R.C. Primary School we will utilize the Lets Read company and our own Rotarian Joan Dayal to source age appropriate and local books for the library. Our expectation then is to have volunteers from our Rotary Club, the community and even parents to spend one hour, one day a week, to sit and read with the students.

We plan to begin this upgrade in January, 2021 in consultation with the Principal and teachers of the school.
