

Rotary Centennial Project Ideas, September 2016

An ad-hoc committee, led by Todd Restel, is meeting to brainstorm and identify a project to commemorate our club's 100th anniversary. Below is a list of ideas that have been generated to date. Please provide your comments. And then add your own ideas for consideration.

1. A project in conjunction with the Riverside Park Band Shell re-design.
2. A project in conjunction with the redevelopment of Trane Park as a park for children with autism.
3. Make over the plaza entrance at the Public Library, Main Branch.
4. A project supporting expansion of International Gardens.
5. Re-build Kid's Coulee. (The current park is showing its age. The Parks and Rec department may demolish the park and rebuild it.)

A note about Kid's Coulee. This project was initially done 25 years ago as our club's 75th anniversary project. This project was done with club members and hundreds of community volunteers. However, times have changed over the last 25 years. The projects today are no longer built with hammer and nails. Special materials are used below ground and in the actual structures in order to prevent injuries and to extend the useful life. Accordingly, many of these projects require specialists in order to maintain the warranties and prevent liability issues. In other words, if Kids Coulee is rebuilt, we will likely not be able to participate in many aspects of the build.
