- Outside the "system," community-based housing and support
- Screen and train volunteers to share their home and resources
- Youth-driven matching process
- Case management support for youth
- Program support for hosts

PROGRAM GOALS

Support youth to:

- Move beyond crisis, feel more stability
- Begin to heal and trust
- Build a sense of self-worth and orientation to the future
- Start pursuing personal goals family relationships, education, employment, housing, skills, health and wellness

YOUTH ELIGIBILITY & EXPECTATIONS

- Ages 16-21
- Continue to attend school and/or work
- Meet regularly with program social worker
- Set and work towards goals for the future
- Abide by host home rules




VOLUNTEER HOST REQUIREMENTS

- Provide shelter and food for a youth
- Be an adult role model (over age 21)
- Have lived in La Crosse County for at least 1 year
- Have renter's or homeowner's insurance
- Authorize and pass background checks
- Complete 16 hours of training
- Create an emergency disaster procedure and fire escape plan for home
