#### Fort McCoy Mission, Vision and Motto


- **Mission Statement:** Underpin Total Force Readiness by serving as a Training Center and a Support Site for Power Projection Missions.



    - This will bring the total number of housing units to 80% of current Housing Market Analysis (120 of 132).
  - Current wait list of 48 Soldiers with Families
  - ACSIM conducted a Housing Market Analysis in May 2017.
