

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Introducing the Random Acts of Kindness Forever Fund











- About 20 years ago, the LPEF Board inspired by an idea from Tom Berkedal, and with support from members like Sue Durtsche and Dr. Sig Gundersen Jr. – launched a program called Random Acts of Kindness.
- Recognized a growing problem children in our community were increasingly coming to school lacking many basic necessities: clothing, shoes, eyeglasses or fees for a field trip.



- The RAK program started with roughly \$200 to \$250 for each school.
- As needs have increased, annual cost has grown to \$25,000 to \$30,000.



• Average middle school or high school spends more than \$2,000 per year.





Long-term solution: RAK Forever Fund

- Annual fundraising has ups and downs
- Create long term solution RAK Forever Fund
 - Permanently restricted fund
 - Use only earnings on principal
- Campaign has raised <u>nearly \$325,000</u> so far.

Almost half of the students in the School District of La Crosse are considered by Federal guidelines to be economically disadvantaged, qualifying them for free or reduced-price lunch. But receiving a nutritious lunch does not meet all of a child's basic needs.

It is difficult for children to be focused and prepared to learn when tired, cold, self-conscious about their appearance, or absent from school.
