Live a year in another country

Enjoy the unique experience of attending high school while living in another country! Rotary International has a program that annually involves over 10,000 high school students living nearly a year in a foreign country.

La Crosse, as part of the Central States Rotary Youth Exchange program, sends students to 44 countries:

Eligibility

Candidates must be sophomores to seniors in high school at the time of application and 16 to 18 1/2 years old when they leave for their assigned country. (However, freshmen are also encouraged to attend the informational session to learn about the program.) Applicants must rank in the upper half of their class.

Exchange students must agree while in their host country they will not drive a motorized vehicle, use drugs, drink alcoholic beverages, or become romantically involved. Laws of the country must be obeyed.

La Crosse area students abroad

Over the years, dozens of La Crosse area students have lived and studied abroad. Many say that it was the best year of their lives. You too can see the world and maybe help change it.



Learning the Language

Learning the language prior to leaving your assigned country is not required, but it is very helpful. Usually, students will adequately learn the language within three months of their arrival with the help of their host family and friends.

Some language preparation may be necessary depending on the country you visit. Many students come back fluent in a new language, which can be a lifelong benefit.

Parents' obligations

A fee of approximately \$6,700 will cover airfare, 4 orientation meetings, medical insurance and administrative expenses. During your student's year abroad, you should experience savings due to food, car insurance, etc.

The hosting Rotary club provides an allowance of \$75 a month for the student to cover incidentals, and is responsible for arranging suitable families who will provide food, lodging, schooling, and supervision.

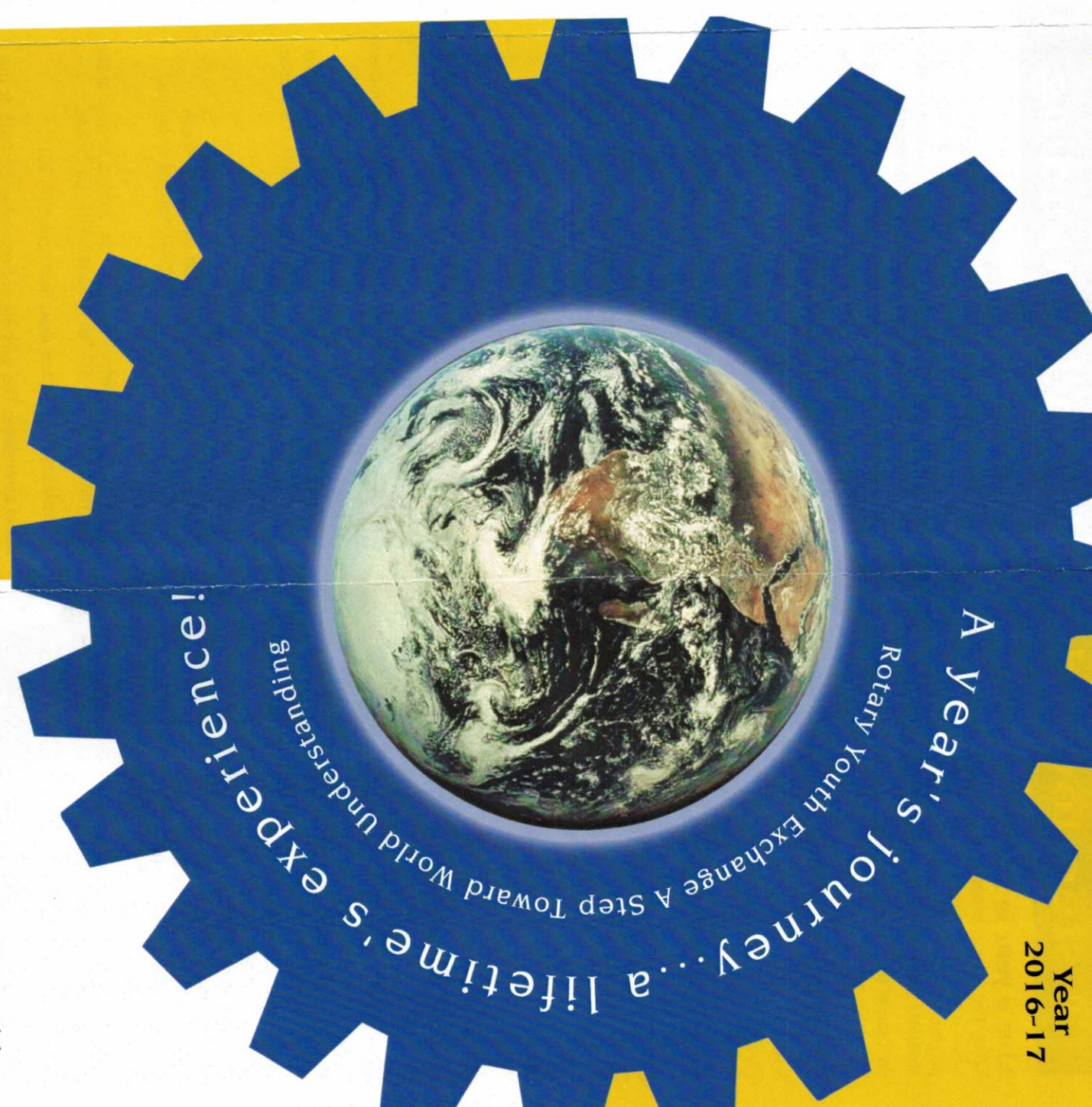
