








History- The Rotary Foundation

- Rotary Works Foundation, a 501 (c) 3 organization, encourages Rotarians to enact the Rotary Four Way Test by financially supporting local and international charitable and educational activities.
- ► The Rotary Club of La Crosse founded the Rotary Foundation in 1982 to provide a separate agency to award grants for local and international activities

How did we become the Rotary Works Foundation?


- In 2008, the foundation became a regional foundation and changed its name. Rotary Works Foundation is made up of the nine Rotary Clubs

What does RWF do?

- ▶ We are unique where we review grants on a **monthly** basis
- We review grants from local community organizations and for rotary international projects
- Grant Application Guidelines
 - Completed Rotary Works Foundation Application
 - Applicants must present a copy of 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(1) designation for consideration
 - Indicate the number impacted by the project or event
 - Need to have approached others for additional financial support Look at timing of the event cannot have already happened
 - Willingness to provide an evaluation or power point presentation at RWF or Club meeting




Who can apply?

- www.rotaryworksfoundation.org
- Grants are considered based on the following criteria:
 - ► Awarded to 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(1) organizations
 - Multi-year grants are discouraged except in support of major projects
 - Funds are awarded prior to projects or events happening
 - Preference given to grant requests involving a Rotarian and projects involving children, youth and families
 - Grants should be received 7 days prior to a Board meeting
 - All grantees are required to report on outcomes of the event or project after completion
 - Grant requests are evaluated for past performance and use of Rotary Works Foundation funds



Help Increase Funds to Create More Impact through District Grants

- ▶ District Grants (DG) match support from local clubs for humanitarian projects that will be completed within a single Rotary year.
- ► Clubs applying for a grant must request a minimum match of US \$500 and up to a maximum US \$5,000. The sponsoring club requesting the grant may also partner with additional D-6250 clubs obtain a grant match up to \$5,000 per club but not exceeding a total of US \$14,500 per project.






What does it mean to be a Legacy Club member for RWF?

- Someone can become a member of the Legacy Club when they donate to the RWF Endowment Fund
 - ► A Total Pledge of \$750 or more
 - ► A Planned Gift of over \$5000

Legacy Club Members receive a Certificate and Medallion, are recognized at a local Rotary Meeting, and may have an opportunity to establish a named fund within the foundation.
