New Members were required to attend a month breakfast meeting every month except in December. Among the topics covered were the Four Avenues of Services. The Rotary Foundation, Rotary International programs and club history. No make-up credit was given for attending these sessions.

Our STAR program is slightly different. We meet for breakfast only six times during the year and you may receive a make-up for attending these sessions. We intend to provide programs on the *Five Avenues of Service*, *The Rotary Foundation* and the *Rotary Works Foundation*, along with other aspects of Rotary.
