nesses. Opportunities exist that some of this conference work can be brought to the Cape, perhaps as early as October 2015. More to come.


RISING STAR - SEAN ARONE, CAPE COD TECH

PROGRAM - KATHY WILLIAMS, YARMOUTH TOWN PLANNER


Phil Morris introduced Kathy Williams, the Town Planner since 2012, to provide some background on the zoning articles appearing on the Warrant for the Annual Town Meeting on Monday, April 7. Kathy is a 1987 graduate of UMass (Amherst) with degree in Civil Engineering. She worked as a consulting engineer for 25 years with an emphasis on affordable housing, mixed use, and streetscape design.

Four of the six zoning articles in the Warrant were more of a "housekeeping" (#31 & 34) or small amendment (#33 & #35) nature. However, the remaining two carried strong community interest, which Kathy added very useful professional and historical perspectives. Article #32 -FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Maps - was of wideranging family and financial importance, locally as well

as regionally. Generating the most Q & A from high interest was Article #30 - Registered Marijuana Dispensaries Bylaw – about which Kathy was able to provide a needed and thoughtful context. (Altogether, it was a confidence-building presentation on local government's due diligence.)
