### RISING STAR - ERIN MCNAMARA, D-Y REGIONAL H.S.



Nicole D'Errico, D-Y Guidance Counselor, presented Erin McNamara as this month's Rising Star from the Dennis-Yarmouth Regional High School as having *"authentic maturity and personal"* integrity," and that was just the start

### PROGRAM - TEACHING FOREIGN LANGUAGE AT MAT-TACHEESE MIDDLE SCHOOL



Ken Jenks, wearing his hat as Rotary Literacy Month Committee Chair (it's also National Poetry Month), introduced three Foreign Language teachers from the Mattacheese Middle School: Maureen Crowley, Tara Mason, and Victoria Yam, who work as a team in so many ways, even as

they have primary responsibilities in different languages. While the teaching & learning of each language may seem to be in mutual competition, the real emphasis within these very strong middle school programs is the immersion learning of other cultures through building the respective social language skills. The middle school two-year language program has the equivalency of the Level One high school language program.

Teaching non-English second languages have undergone many changes since the days of the old-style "drill & kill"



methods. Today, it is deemed very important to engage the student at the very beginning of the first year of foreign language learning, particularly considering the impact of *not* being able to participate later in the

ever-important global economy. Another change is the use of technology - such as iPads and Google Earth - for students to create conversations & illustrations; to hear themselves and help one another; and to show their work and to learn a culture. Students still have to learn vocabulary and grammar; but, as was highlighted by these three articulate professionals, importance is on the four skills of reading, writing, speaking, and listening.


