Guest Speaker Alicia Gatspur - Duffy

Healthcare – Our guest speaker this week was Alicia Gatspur from Duffy Healthcare. Alicia oversees the program, Mom's Do Care!, which is a program designed to help mothers abdicated to opioids. Among Massachusetts' 14 counties, Barnstable ranked 4th in 2017 for overdoses per 100,000 in population. The program is designed to break down barriers, help access resources available and care for the mothers and ultimately the unborn children. The program has expanded to not only women and infants, but up to 3 years of age. Who is eligible? Residents in Barnstable County who are 18 years of age and over, who are pregnant or have children under the age of 3 and have a diagnosis of opioid disorder. They don't need to be current drug users, but have used them in the past.

Alicia oversees a staff of 3 RNs with regular office hours at the methadone clinics, OB office at Cape Cod Hospital. and see people at community events and meetings. They oversee the care plan and family planning, especially to address future plans to have other children, etc. Since 2015, over 70 women have been enrolled. She noted that babies are born

The Recovery Coaches are the heart and soul of what the organization is about. They meet with the patients and develop a recovery and relapse recovery plan. Connect women to services in the community such as WIC and the Baby Center.

Anyone in the community can refer patients to Moms Do Care! Ask permission for the MDC staff to call them, or the best way is to make the call WITH the person you are referring. The main number is 508-280-6597.

Alicia closed by stating, "Getting over the stigma is the hardest part. Being pregnant is hard enough, and adding addiction to it, it ends up being very difficult to patients."
