
Annual Town Clean Up Day Saturday April 29, 2017

GUEST SPEAKER: JACOB STAPLETON, FROM CHILDREN'S COVE

Children's Cove is the Child Advocacy Center for the Cape and Islands. While this was a returning presentation from the organization to the Yarmouth Rotary, it was a first visit for Jacob Stapledon, their Community Education and Outreach Coordinator. He noted that, as he participated in their public awareness campaign, he had already heard through the Director, Stacy Gallagher, that the Yarmouth Rotary was "doing great things with families."

Jacob outlined aspects of increasing community engagement and understanding of Children's Cove and their mission: providing coordinated and comprehensive multidisciplinary services to child victims of sexual abuse/ serious physical abuse and their families. These efforts necessitate high quality care, thorough investigatory follow up, and effective measures to minimize trauma.

Child abuse knows no barriers-not race, religion, income or geography. 90% of the time, a child is sexually abused by someone they know, love, and trust. One in four girls and one in six boys will be sexually abused before their 18th birthday, and 30% of those sexual abuse victims never disclose their abuse. On top of that, among young adults who had been sexually abused as children, it was found that as many as 80% suffered at least one psychiatric disorder by the age of 21 (depression, anxiety, suicide attempts, bulimia and anorexia), and an increased likelihood of juvenile arrest, drug abuse, and adult violent crime.

Among the range of responses on the part of Children's Cove is the goal of promoting awareness and prevention for the community and the partner agencies through education. A very successful consequence of this engagement effort is the formation of a Teen Task Force, a group that has had a great impact. Jacob called forth a member of this outreach group, a member of the Rotary family, Amelia Tardif. She described "what a great groups teens in their encouragement and support" of their peers to speak up; and it has lead to an increase in disclosing and reporting. After all, for young people ages 12 to 16, this is a "time of learning what's appropriate." One lesson to be learned: the earlier the reporting, the greater the impact and the healthier the outcome.

Jacob concluded with summarizing the need for continued support, both community and financial (e.g., only 80% of funding comes from Barnstable County).
