The programs are held from 1-3 PM every 3rd Thursday of each month at the church. It supports approximately 50 clients each month which translates to supporting about 150 individuals within their families, of all ages and diversity. The program costs the church about \$300-\$400 per week. Cash donations are best because they have access to products at cheaper costs than the public. They also have a visiting dental hygienist and nurse who helps with flu shots and other basic but important care.
