### ROTARY FOUNDATION MOMENT: STEVE ALBRIGHT

PP Steve Albright provided a very positive Polio Plus update with the news that in September, the country of Nigeria will be added to the list of countries that have gone a year without a new case of polio, leaving only Pakistan and Afghanistan where polio remains. The R.I. donation of \$688 million and the effort of thousands of volunteers have paid off in greatly diminishing the former level of 200,000 annual cases. The abolition of polio will save \$15 billion in human costs.

Steve also used the occasion of the Foundation Moment to induct the newest Paul Harris Fellow – Jill Albright who, along with her Paul Harris pin and membership, was the recipient of a spousal osculation.

### PROGRAM: KEVIN RALPH, CAPE COD HEALTHCARE FOUNDATION

Matt Fitzsimmons handled the introduction of Kevin Ralph, Chief Development Officer for Cape Cod Healthcare; and Ralph, in turn, introduced colleague Pat Cane, Senior Vice-President for Marketing. Ralph gave an overview of the CC Healthcare Foundation, the changes that are taking place to healthcare reimbursement, and the growing role of professional fundraising teamwork and community partnerships. He noted, that while Cape Cod Healthcare is one of the country's top 15 health systems, it "is not a stand alone organization."
