GUEST SPEAKERS: MICHAEL ROBBINS & VICTO-RIA KENNER - A STORY OF ILLNESS, SELFLESS GIVING, & RELATIONSHIP BONDING

Mike Robbins is Cape Codder who had kidney disease and was at high risk for kidney failure – which they did in 2013. He was hospitalized with lifesaving, but kidneyremoving, surgery. No kidney function meant a life doing blood dialysis three days a week, four hours at a time for each process. The average life expectancy for a patient on dialysis was three to five years. Another option was to wait for a transplant operation from a "kidney harvest." The standard wait for an available kidney by this method was five to ten years.

He was advised that the remaining third option was to "find *your own kidney.*" He undertook that avenue with a flurry of public requests and publicity through brochures, business cards, presentations, TV and radio appearances, print media stories, and internet social media. No usable responses came forward until (almost as a last resort) Mike put a sign on his lawn, poignantly requesting a life-enhancing donation of a kidney. He received 15 inquiries within two weeks; with one volunteer being a perfect match. That match was Tori Kenner, "a young lady" with 3 children and a job as First Sergeant in the National Guard at Otis.

After rigorous mental and physical testing – and insuring that **Tori** would remain deployable in the event of a military call up – the transplant surgeries took place in June 2015. All went well, and both individuals feel great and acknowledge that each has had their life changed for the better. Tori reveals that when she saw his sign, she knew she was "meant to do this." Today, being a living donor means "we're family now." And Mike put up a large "Thank you, Tori" lawn sign for the world to know.
