Coats For Veterans - Mike Duffy gave an update on Coats for Veterans. He encouraged all Rotarians to stop by Ocean State Job Lot, who is running a deal where if you buy a coat for a Veteran for \$40, you get a \$40 gift card. Let's all go and support!

Veterans House in Dennis - Jim Seymour gave an update regarding the veterans home in Dennis and stated that the land is now cleared and they are waiting for spring to lay the foundation.

Ski Weekend Fellowship—A weekend ski fellowship is being planned for Jan. 31—Feb 3 in Bartlett NH. This is the first of what we hope will become an annual event. For more details, contact Chantel Rice.

Guest Speaker Jackie Carnevali - Jackie gave an update on the progress at the Mahkta School and the expansion that has taken place. The Rotary Club of Yarmouth began its support of the Maktha School in Hyderabad India in 2011, with an \$18K Global Matching Grant. The grant provided a new school building excavation of the grounds, toilets, a reverse osmosis system, a library, preschool furnishings, and a playground for the children. There are now 5 students who have graduated from Maktha and are on the path towards university. There are 25 students who are in the post-high school/pre-university programs. Annual support continued to provide important items including a kitchen building, bore well, supplementary breakfast, pest control, and a water harvesting pit. Enrollment has increased from 230 to 560 students and the bifurcation of the school to include ECC, primary and high school programs.

The Carnevali Foundation funds an English teacher, an Ayah and Watchman, a librarian and school liaison counselor who mentors the scholarship students and meets weekly with the Headmaster regarding any issues for maintenance and supplies.

Jackie also spoke about some exciting new initiatives. Based on a guest of the Yarmouth Rotary club who began an adult reading program in Guatemala, the Carnevali Foundation began, what Jackie called, "the most exciting event, one of which I am so proud of - adult reading classes." She mentioned that adults are nervous to enter the school yard because most have never been. There are currently 13-14 women who are studying 3 nights per week and learning the alphabet. One year later, the teacher showed Jackie the lessons and there were pages filled of their work. Several women approached Jackie and showed her how far they have come. Additionally, they were the 1st government school to install solar in Hyderabad.
