The Main Event

New Member Ted Atwood – Ted Atwood was inducted as a new member by District Governor Elect Steve Albright. Ted addressed the club and mentioned that he is thankful that he was able to participate in two of the hallmark events of the club: the Champ House Thanksgiving and Children's Christmas Party. Welcome to the club Ted!

Guest Speaker Deb Willsea - Cape Cod Toy Library - Deb Willsea, of the Cape Cod Toy Library, spoke to the club. She is originally from the Rochester. NY area and began a family play learning center which was the first library. A toy library provides community access to toys. Rochester's toy library has served 350,000 people and continues to provide tremendous access to high-quality educational toys to the community. This same concept was brought to Cape Cod. She mentioned that while research continues to show play is essential for children's healthy development, play is often missing in children's lives today. Play not only facilitates learning, it also helps heal. The toy libraries Deb runs create enriching environments that enhance children and family play experiences and provide a library of high quality educational play materials and resources for all areas of child development. She stated that more families are struggling financially and play is at risk. There has been a marked decline in children's emotional and creative development and many children are not be prepared without healthy early childhood development. Childhood play is the foundation for development and success. Deb suggested that many parents are not aware of the serious ill effects from digital devices. A little known fact, 30-40% of Cape Cod's preschool aged children are not enrolled in preschools. Toy libraries help to fill this void.

Since launching in 2017 - 400 children and families have participated. When children enter a play space and see the toys, the children immediately know and enjoy the experience.

The next steps for Cape Cod Toy Library is to add to the toy collection, develop partnerships in the community and funding support, and acquire a large space (4-5,000 sq. feet) to accommodate the programming.
