Cotuit Center for the Performing Arts - David Kuehn, the Executive Director for the CCPA, presented to the club about the center The CCPA has 6 full time staff and 6 part time with over 1,000 volunteers annually who contribute 10-20,000 hours of volunteer support annually. All of the actors and performers are 100% nonprofessional theatre actors, and thus it is a 100% community thea tre based. The center is open year round and they receive over 35,000 visitors and 15,000 performance attendees annually. There are 2 art gallery spaces that features 20 gallery exhibits each year. Exhibitors include locals, regional and /international artists. In the summer there is a concert series that features local artists as well as famous musicians such as Art Garfunkel. There are also school facilities featuring 125 classes each year on visual, performing and literary arts. During the summer, the center has over 140 hours of programming in 8 spaces each week. The mission of the organization is to provide a venue for people to enjoy the arts on Cape Cod. The center provides community outreach efforts for performing and visual arts opportunities for adults with disabilities of all ranges and put them on stage and does theatre production where they are rock stars. They work with many social service organizations to provide exposure to the arts including Cape Cod Child Development and arts education for incarcerated youth in Nickerson State Park. For veterans, there is a monthly drumming circle for those suffering from PTSD. David invited the club and public to visit the center and enjoy the arts at any time!
