<p>Guest Speaker Jim Bogle – Jim was our guest speaker this week and gave a comical recap of how he came to be on Cape Cod and in his profession as an accountant. He was raised in the Boston suburbs, went to UMass Amherst which lasted 3 months. He was advised to return to school when he was ready to study. He then moved to Brighton with 3 other guys and the only individual making money was the accountant. It was at that point that Jim decided to study accounting and graduated from Bentley College. He worked for 6 years for an accounting firm during which he met his wife. They decided to move to Cape Cod when given the opportunity to acquire an accounting practice. The individual he acquired the business from had issues with the IRS, so the business was slow to start! They bought a house on the Cape in 1974, and got a great deal from a developer. After legal issues with the building of the development, the bank eventually got the house back and they needed to move. The developer went into federal prison for a multitude of charges, including flying a twin engine plane in South America with a powdery substance aboard. Their second house came with something called a “Certificate of Title,” which was advantageous to the new homeowners. They are living in that house to this day. Mr. and Mrs. Bogle have 3 adult, all of whom graduated from Dennis-Yarmouth Regional High School. All 3 sons went to college. One is a teacher, the other two now work for a prestigious well-known accounting firm in West Yarmouth. They are blessed with two grandchildren. If you have received the vaccine, you will probably either not get it or get a mild case. Elderberry extract is a good remedy. Dr. Bruce urged everyone to get vaccinated. He recommended regarding the pneumonia shot that everyone over 60 should get one. The shot covers about 75% of the strands out there. The vaccines work for 6-8 years with a booster every few years. There are 2 things that matter with public health in terms of longevity - vaccinations and clean water. We are providing both in Rotary.</p>
