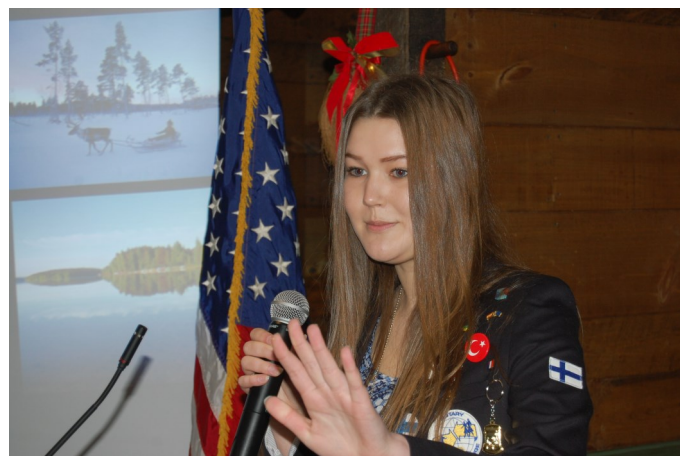

PROGRAM:

Phil Morris presented a fund raising support request and background about the 9th Annual Cape Cod Games of the Special Olympics of Cape Cod and Martha's Vineyard, to be held in May. During the School Day Games events, students with special needs – from schools from all across Cape Cod and Martha's Vineyard – will participate in a variety of Olympic-style events lead by student leaders and volunteers from the Dennis-Yarmouth Regional High School. Starting with the traditional Opening Ceremony, students compete or participate in three or more activities (depending on the sports chosen), and each is awarded for their accomplishments in formal awards presentation at the end of the event.

Special Olympics provide a platform through sports to help change the attitudes and perceptions of youth and young adults toward peers with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Through programs of *transformative education*, Special Olympics programs help to solve the problems of isolation and misunderstanding in the classroom. Students with these disabilities are two to three times more likely to be bullied than their peers without intellectual disabilities. Research has provided the evidence that the bullying in this context was chronic in nature and was likely to be directly related to their disability.
