<div>The Main Event</div> <div>New Member Induction - DGE Stephen Albright introduced Chuck Soule to the club and invited him to join the worldwide membership in Rotary, including 1.2 million Rotarians around the world. Steve thanked Chuck for being willing to give Service Above Self and joining Yarmouth Rotary. Chuck spoke to the club. He is an ordained minister at the West Yarmouth Congregational Church. He has three children and was previously in the auto industry for 25 years. He is an active volunteer with many organizations, including the Yarmouth Fire Department as Chaplain, Habitat for Humanity and Housing Assistance Corporation. Welcome to the club Chuck!</div> <div>DY Rising Star - Lisa Fedey, guidance counselor at DY, introduced the January Rising Star from the Rogers family. Sean Rogers is known for his integrity, reliability, and his ability to teach and connect with students with disabilities. “Sean has left a positive and powerful impact on students that he has come into contact with. He shows up every day on time and ready to contribute. He supports his students and his students love Mr. Rogers. Persistence, respect for self and others, passion for helping others, and ability to act on it. A life well lived is a life of service,” said Ms. Fedey. Sean addressed the club by stating, “Welcome to my neighborhood, I’m Mr. Rogers!” In the 10th grade, he came to begin working with the Wave program for students with special needs. This move changed his life. He began work-based learning and working with children at Station Ave Elementary. After beginning work-based learning at the suggestion of his brother, he began to look forward to coming to school every day. “I learned so much from the children, but also the adults, which was equally as important. A second year in the program has given me the opportunity to learn more from a different teacher with a different perspective but same end goal. I enjoy it so much that I intend to make it my career.” Kudos to Sean Rogers and his family!</div> <div>Habitat Build – Paul Chatelain updated the club on the Habitat for Humanity build on January 19. Either way, thank you to those who volunteered to help!</div>			<div>RAGNAR Road Race/TIPS Certification – The club will be participating in the RAGNAR Road Race event on Saturday, May 11. For the RAGNAR race, need 25 volunteers from the club staggered over the course of the day. This will be a major fundraiser for the club and will bring a lot of business to Yarmouth with over 5,000 runners. There will be 4 hours shifts for signups, sheet coming soon. We will need 12-13 people to become TIPS certified to pour beer to the 5,000 runners. The two dates for certification are January 21, 12-3PM and January 23, 5-8PM, both at the Red Jacket Resort. Contact Curly Carey to sign up!</div> <div>Guest Speaker Jim McLaughlin – Our own Jim McLaughlin serves as the Commander in Chief of the Gosnold Division and Training Ship Patriot State for the US Nave Sea Cadet Corps. Jim gave a history of the US Navy Sea Cadet Corps, which was chartered by Congress in 1962 and the official sponsor is the US Navy League. It is a nonprofit organization between ages 11 and 18 with the mission of building better citizens, not necessarily a military career. There are 24 units in Massachusetts and currently 7 staff members and 30 cadets that meet at Massachusetts Maritime Academy. There are two components in the program: the League Cadets and Sea Cadets. The League Cadets are for ages 11-13 and the Sea Cadets are up to age 18. For those completing the program and enlisting in the armed forces, they will enter Navy or Coast Guard with an advanced pay grade. The advancements and ranks are similar to those in the Navy or Coast Guard. There are bi-weekly dress (meetings) from 10am - 3pm on Saturdays. These dress meetings consist of classes, physical fitness, and military drills. There are several cadet leadership positions within the unit, who compete annually in a skills competition at Joint Base Cape Cod with 150 cadets participating in 10 events. Jim then introduced Chief Petty Officer Daniel Nunes who is the leading cadet and a senior in high school in Marshfield. Nunes joined when he was 11 years old and has been a member of the honor guard, swim team and silent drill team. “I always had the drive to serve our country.” He was encouraged to visit the Newport Naval War College to see the museum and this sparked tremendous interest. “I have participated in two assignments with the Coast Guard. Chief Petty Officer is the highest rank in Sea Cadets, which is equivalent to Eagle Scouts.” Nunes has enlisted in the Army and will begin basic training in July.
