Phil Morris introduced Kathy William, Yarmouth Town Planner, on a return visit to the Yarmouth Rotary


The Planning Division is a component of the Department of Community Development & Planning. The Planning Division reviews all subdivision plans and refers applicants to the Planning Board as required by the Subdivision Control Laws. The division is also responsible for long range planning issues and coordinates the efforts for the Local Comprehensive Plan. Issues concerning the Zoning Bylaw, Subdivision Rules & Regulations, Yarmouth Architectural and Site Design Standards, the Village Centers Overlay District (VCOD), the Revitalization Architectural Overlay District (R.O.A.D), and the Growth Incentive Zone are also part of the Planning Division purview.

Kathy gave an insightful update on "Things around Town," illustrating through a PowerPoint presentation particular areas of ● the three phases of the construction of the Cape Cod Rail Trail within Yarmouth (including a Station Avenue bridge), and the CPA (Community preservation Act) applications that will be articles in the 2016 Yarmouth Town Meeting warrant: ● Packet Landing proposed pavilion and restrooms, ● Parkers River Tidal Restoration project (plus Route 28 bridge replacement) and ● the proposed Parkers River Riverwalk/Boardwalk.

#### PRESENTATION FROM FOUR D-Y STUDENTS:

Four local D-Y 9<sup>th</sup> grade students came forward to present their humanitarian and house-building mission to Haiti during the week of February 13 to 20, along with their request for financial support.

These highly motivated students are Francesca Barbi, Katy
Faust, Austin Anderson, and Alexis DeNisi. They are doing this under the auspices of a well-established and registered 501c3 non-profit organization known as The Fuller Center for Housing that builds and renovates houses in partnership with families in need. The Fuller Center itself is an international ecumenical Christian housing ministry dedicated to eliminating poverty housing worldwide. The students are participating under the Fuller Center's Global Builders program.

As noted on the relevant website (<a href="http://fullercenter.org/global-builders">http://fullercenter.org/global-builders</a>): "Global Builders get to see the real world off the beaten path, immersing themselves in different cultures for 1-2 weeks and truly getting to know people from different lands -- all while making a difference in their lives by helping families build safe, decent homes." The students are volunteering under the Haiti Empowerment Program that works through Haitians to help build or rebuild sturdy homes. The students will be part of a 15-member group in Pignon, Haiti, and includes two teachers and ten adult volunteers, under the direction of Team Leaders Christina Todd & Kat Williams (best email: <a href="mailto:beau-tykat@gmail.com">beau-tykat@gmail.com</a>). Safety is paramount, and each student is paired with an adult.

Cost per student comes in at \$1180 and covers supplies, food, and housing. The students have established their own <u>Fundraising Page</u> with opportunity to donate to them as individuals or as a team: (http://fullercenter.donorpages.com/GlobalBuilders/BuildingBridgesCapeCodtoPignon/).
