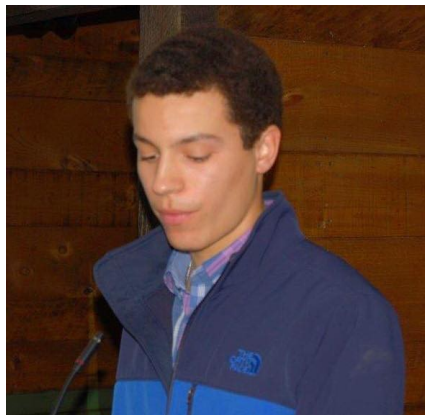

### **RIISING STAR: CAMDEN MAZZONI, DENNIS-YARMOUTH REGIONAL H.S.**

On a return visit, **Nicole D’Errico**, D-Y Guidance Counselor and a friend of Yarmouth Rotary, gave a whole-hearted prologue to the honoring of **Cam Mazzoni**, D-Y Rising Star. **Cam** has a 4.12 GPA and is ranked 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Senior Class of 2017. His approach to academics is obviously successful, but not because he “grinds it out.” His attitude is one enjoying challenges, taking courses that stimulate his curiosity and boost his knowledge. This purposeful quality of his character contributes to his insight, composure, and empathy.

### **GUEST SPEAKER: DR. THOMAS BURNS, VETERINARY ASSOCIATES OF CAPE COD**

**Dr. Thomas Burns** is most often known for his professional credentials as a veterinarian and the Director of the animal hospital, The Veterinary Associates of Cape Cod in South Yarmouth. However, his presentation to the Yarmouth Rotary was centered on another passion of his: Ocean Conservancy – with particular interest in shark conservation and the sharks of New England. He has been diving and photographing sharks for 25 years. He is particularly pleased to be a contributor to the National Geographic Magazine’s edition of July 2016 and its coverage of sharks and their conservation.

**Dr. Burns** placed particular emphasis to great white sharks in local waters, but he added additional perspectives about other shark species that can be found locally: basking, tiger, blue dog, mako, and scalloped hammerhead. He does his diving as a free dive (that is, without scuba gear), which adds both a degree of difficulty as well as closeness - all in an ongoing effort toward research and understanding. Seemingly, the span of new information he presented was embracing and ardent.
