#### Other updates from past exchange students:



YARMOUTH - The Yarmouth Police Department is losing a valuable asset.

According to a Yarmouth police release, K9 dog Kosmo has been forced to retire due to an injury. The on-the-job spinal injury has made it impossible for Kosmo to work as a police dog, ending his 5+ year career.

Kosmo will spend his retirement with his handler Patrol Officer Mike Kramer and his family. Kosmo began working as a police dog at the age of 14-months. Called a crime-fighting hero by Deputy Chief Steven Xiarhos, Kosmo has been instrumental in finding missing children and adults and running down more than this fair share of suspects, according to the release.

During one memorable call in 2013, Kosmo was sent into the eves of a home in Sandwich when a suspect refused to come out of hiding for police. In 2011, Kosmo located an assault suspect <a href="hiding in a pile of leaves">hiding in a pile of leaves</a>. In 2014, <a href="Kosmo nabbed a suspect">Kosmo nabbed a suspect</a> who had snatched a purse from a 70-year-old woman.

Deputy Chief Xiarhos said the department will want to replace Kosmo as soon as possible and hopes the unforeseen \$9,000 expense will win the approval of residents at town meeting this spring.

<u>Kosmo, a specially-bred German Shepherd from Slovakia</u>, was purchased in 2011 using funds seized from convicted drug dealers.
