

2014—2015 in Review

FOOD PANTRY: We volunteered at the "fill a cruiser food drives." Our members and spouses volunteer weekly at the food pantry, stocking shelves and participating in the many weekly distributions of food each week. Our members serve as officers and directors of the food pantry. Curly's Crew raised over \$6,000 for the food pantry when we sponsored his Boston Marathon Run.

BROWN BAG: We filled over 1,200 brown bags for the senior center this year.

<u>MEALS ON WHEELS:</u>We delivered over 1000 meals on Tuesday mornings this year.

<u>CHRISTMAS AUCTION:</u>We raised over \$15,000 this year. It was an increase of \$6,000 over the previous year.

<u>CHILDREN'S HOLIDAY PARTY:</u> We again hosted 100 people at this year holiday party for FOOD, FUN, and GIFTS.

MATKA SCHOOL PROJECT: We donated over \$5,500 in support of <u>OUR</u> school in India. An additional grade was added to the school this year. A deep well was drilled so the school will not run out of water. This school continues to grow and prosper and is one great example of Rotarian teamwork.

GOOD WORKS: We donated almost \$22,000 to various worthwhile projects, groups and individuals. Some of these were the 5th grade Atlas project, Caring for the troops, Socks for the troops, Kaitlin's Closet, Champ House, Full Back Pack, Tower of Power, and many, many more.

<u>COMMUNITY SERVICE</u>: Packets landing: We cleaned and weeded all of the planting beds at the Gateway to Yarmouth. Champ House: We've served over 500 meals to the residents there this year. We will continue with this great project again this year.

<u>SCHOLARSHIPS:</u> We awarded a total of 16 scholarships at DY, CC Tech and Sturgis for a total of \$16,500.

ROTARY FOUNDATION: We donated a combined total of over \$6,000 to the Rotary Foundation supporting both, the annual fund and the polio plus funds. We are so close to eradicating Polio from the face of the earth.It is a fight we must continue fight and a project we must continue to support.

CAPE COD HOSPITAL BLOODMOBILE: Our club spearheaded the effort and with the combined effort of other Rotary Clubs on Cape Cod, a total of \$100,000 was raised and donated to Cape Cod Hospital for the purchase of a new Bloodmobile.
