- Public Safety Announcement The normal year-round population of Yarmouth is 25,000. During the week of the 4th, the population is expected to be around 75,000. Prepare for no left hand turns on Route 28, a traffic jam from Provincetown to Bourne, and especially heavy traffic at dusk around Lewis Bay in Yarmouth and Hyannis! Everyone stay safe!
- Recognition of Service to Club as Director -Immediate past President Matt Fitzsimmons recognized Jim Saben with a plaque for his contributions to the board over many years of tenure. Kudos and thank you Jim for your I leadership!



- **International Conference** Kevin reported that Steve & Jill, Barry and Gail and Sondra attended the 109th International Conference in Toronto last week. There was estimated to be over 25k Rotarians in attendance. Speakers at the conference included current Rotary International (RI) president Ian Riseley and 2018/2019 President Barry Rassin, Former First Lady Laura Bush and the Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau. RI President Rassin spoke about RIs new initiative, once polio is eradicated, which will be a \$1.5 billion dollar water project in Haiti. The goal will be do provide clean drinking water to all residents of Haiti. President Rassin also spoke about the importance of increasing membership and retaining Rotaract Members. Rotaract will now have a seat on RIs Governing Council for the first time.
 - **Guest Speaker Brian Weiner from the Friends of Bass River** – The group's mission is to help preserve and protect Bass River's delicate ecosystem. Brian's career was doing philanthropic work and raising funds and the environment is a deep personal interest of his. Has been with the group for 3 months, however, has been coming to Bass River since 1964. The almost the only one we have/cleanup days of river has changed unbelievably and challenged in many ways including flushing. There are currently 400 citizens who have joined the organization. There was a massive cleanup effort in June where over 500 lbs of trash was picked up, and tomorrow a "friendraiser" to introduce others to the group. A-politically oriented just concerned with preserving the river.

Why does Bass River need our help? Parts of the river are literally dying due to nitrogen overloading. He showed a video that highlighted how nitrogen loading has affected the river.

Why the work is vitally important? The river faces 47 percent more nitrogen than it can actually handle, higher in the summer months with increased people on and around it. One of the easiest cures is to pump septic systems on a bi-annual basis. Septic systems contribute 81 percent of the nitrogen source to the river. He also noted that the golf course's program of fertilization is running right into the river and with sediment that has contributed to lots of still points in the river. Follins Pond is literally chocking.

Seven tactics/plans Brian noted that they need help with are:

- 1. Active advocates focused on bridge reconstruction work so that river will be better, reduce piling that are blocking flow by 60 percent, span will be wider and won't need as many support piling.
- 2. Trash out of the river, particularly plastics
- 3. Free boat pump outs mariners should use these services
- 4. Convinced if reach critical mass, people will listen, goal of attracting 1.000 members
- 5. Fundraise quietly members are generous and everything raised is pushed back out, no overhead
- 6. Hire a master planner help solidify a vision for the rivers future
- 7. Involved educators and students Teacher from DY interested in getting students involved
