

The Main Event

Guest Speaker Dr. K. David Weidner, Pilgrim Monument and Provincetown Museum – Dr. Weidner presented to the club about the Pilgrim Monument. It is the oldest nonprofit on Cape Cod and was erected from 1907-1910. Dr. Weidner took over the leadership position in 2017 and The Cape Cod Pilgrim Memorial Association (the "Association") is a private nonprofit, educational organization whose mission is to maintain the Pilgrim Monument and Provincetown Museum buildings and land (the "PMPM") to accommodate its libraries and collections. The Association's mission is also to commemorate the history of the Mayflower Pilgrims, culminating in their arrival and stay in Provincetown Harbor and the signing of the Mayflower Compact.

The Association's mission further includes the collection, preservation, research, exhibition and publication of archival materials on all aspects of Provincetown history, including the contributions of the Wampanoag and other indigenous peoples whose presence in the region predates the arrival of the Mayflower, the rise of the whaling industry, the advent of the Portuguese fishing community, and the evolution of Provincetown as a center of tolerance, art, and theater in the 20th Century, including the important role of the LGBT community in that evolution.

Due to the pandemic, the organization lost approximately 80% of its revenue. In a normal year, the museum sees over 100,000 visitors. They also provide time for the 5th graders to spend a day at the museum through the National Environmental Education Development Academy (NEED) as part of their study on the National Seashore.

Dr. Weidner spoke of the Bradford Street Access Project, which has been under construction and should be opening soon. "We want everyone to enjoy the richness of Provincetown and its history. By extending our front door to Bradford Street, we can facilitate even more commerce with our local businesses and excitement for visitors. The value of the Bradford Access Project will be felt long after its completion."

The inclined elevator will improve physical access from PMPM to Bradford Street and Commercial Street. It will provide a safe and simple way to get to the streets that will connect visitors with the shops, restaurants, wharf areas, Town Hall and other important landmarks in Province-town. The institution's vision, dating back to 1910, was to create a connection with the Town of Provincetown and the Pilgrim Monument. The Monument stands tall as a beacon of welcoming, tolerance and acceptance. During the height of the Portuguese fishing industry, the Monument was even used by mariners to locate their home, Provincetown, a place of safety. Like today, we welcome all to Provincetown and the connection to the Monument is made stronger by the construction of the inclined elevator. We see the inclined elevator as the realization of the vision with the goal to grow and make the institution stronger.

This is just the first step in a journey to transform PMPM from a local, community museum into a world-class destination for history enthusiasts. By providing accurate and informative education about our town, and its original inhabitants, the Wampanoag Nation, our true place in history will be assured.

Quick Answers to Frequent Questions

- IS THERE AN ADMISSION FEE?
 Yes, the admission fee covers both Museum and Monument. Allow about ai hour for your visit.
 HOW TALL IS THE PILGRIM MONUMENT?
- 252 feet and 7.5 inches (77m). WHEN WAS IT BUILT? Construction
- WHERE ARE THE RESTROOMS? There are no public restrooms here. Restrooms for Monument and Museum visitors only are located in the Provincetown Museum building.
- CAN I GO TO THE TOP?
 Yes. You can easily walk to the top of Piligrim Monument using a series of 60 ramps and 116 stairs, as shown in this culaway drawing. There is no elevator. The Monument is not wheelchair accessible.

Admissions and donations are used to maintain and operate these facilities by the Cape Col Phyrim Mexiciation, oldest non-profit educational institution on Cape Cod, chartered in 1892.

CAPE COD BRITE LIGHTS

You have heard me mention or talk about the new 501c(3) corporation that was recently started by our Rotary Club. It is named Cape Cod Brite Lights and its mission is to help those in need on Cape Cod. Our main focus to date has been to provide weekend backpacks of nutritional food for needy elementary students in the DY School System. A backpack of food consists of shelf stable milk (white & chocolate), juice carton, cereal, instant oatmeal, two proteins which could be a can of tuna, chicken, pasta, soup or beef stew, a cup of apple sauce, macaroni and cheese, Nutra grain fruit granola bar, cheese its, fruit snacks, pudding cup and 2 pieces of fruit. In addition, to give each student some activities to do during the holiday break we put a coloring book and crayons in each bag. We started with a total of 25 students but have grown to 45, an increase of over 80%.

In addition, to the backpacks we have focused on providing a weekly food bag to clients at Community Connections. These clients are ones that are living on their own but are also struggling to keep their heads above water. About 15 – 18 food items are provided each week to each client to help supplement their food insecurities.

How you can help:

First: Currently we have a board of directors of 11 members. Our bylaws allow us to have a maximum number of 13. If you would like to be a part of our leadership, please contact Steve Albright.

Second: We fill the backpacks and bags of food every Wednesday night at 6:00 PM at the Yarmouth Food Pantry. If you would like to help one or two nights a month, again please contact Steve Albright. Currently we have enlisted the local Girl Scout Troop to help on the first Wednesday of each month and the DY Interact Club to help on the second Wednesday of each month. We are trying to make it a community organization where anybody can be a part of it.

Third: It costs \$150 yearly to support one child's backpack and \$250 yearly to support a weekly food bag. If you would like to financially support a child or a Community Connection client, checks can be mailed to:



All of the items collected will be shipped to Africa to help disabled individuals gain mobility that they never have had.
