#### **Guest Speaker- From Cape Leadership Institute, Bob Cody**

Since 1992, CLI's annual Leadership Cape Cod class has introduced participants to the topics and leaders affecting the Cape's future in business, healthcare, politics, social services and other areas. Bob Cody, Exec Director:

Throughout his career Bob has a demonstrated record of leadership, problem-solving, organizational development, maximizing individual contributions, and continuous operational improvement. He brings over 25 years of leadership experience in corporate, academic and non-profit organizations. In positions of vice-president of worldwide research, development and engineering, dean of academic and student affairs, board member and board chair, Cody has led organizations in innovation and growth specializing in developing new programs, products and services, while increasing revenue and organizational growth, leading change management transformations to take those organizations to new levels of performance. In his prior position he was the chief executive partner of Innoreate, a business consulting firm. A member of the CLI class of 2012, Cody brings a passion for community service with him to CLI..

Beginning in 1992, CLI's mission was to connect current and future leaders to address issues on cape and islands. They currently have over 700 alumni and they continue to engage these alumni as they are actively involved in solving community problems. They have ongoing discussions with community leaders on 11 key segments including:

Leadership, economy, media, healthcare, legal, social services, arts, community, environment, education, government and civic engagement.

They seek to engage local businesses and community organizations to expose members to all geographic areas of the cape and island; they are creative community trustees Similar to Rotary they get involved in community projects that meet community needs.

They recently made a strategic decision to "shift" from a program to an organization, "Leadership Cape Cod essentially rebranding itself and expanding its programs with the core components staying the same. Bob defined a few of the programs that exist or are on the horizon:

Board bootcamps- roles and responsibilities of being on a Board Senior Executive Programs

Youth Programs- Juniors and Seniors- entrepreneurship programs and Teacher Programs-

Speaker Bureau- accessing over 700 alumni

Consulting and Training- grow business, strategic planning
They are a non-profit funded by donations, fee by members, and
