

HOSPITALIZED CHILDREN

Jay Stevens, from Harwich, MA, is truly in service to children who are in medical treatment within the hospital setting. However, his service does not originate from training as a medical professional, but as a committed and trained professional in an "entertainment" field. He is a graduate of Clown College, and he works with and supervises a tenmember team of clown performers at Boston Children's Hospital – a teaching institution and the #1 ranked pediatric hospital. He also writes a monthly anecdotal "Notes from the Floor," and he drew upon those observations and other related experiences to narrate some very moving stories and to explain the motivations, insights, and results stemming from the teamwork of the Clown Care Unit.

Jay has logged a lot of miles in this "crazy long commute" to Children's, but they are soon to celebrate the 21st anniversary of their relationship with the hospital. It is a most difficult venue in which to work, because they see families in a very personal way, sometimes at their worst, and some children don't recover. Along with his clown colleagues "Nurse Moose, Dr. Gonegolfing, and Dr. Maladiusted," they want to be force for better, and some of the time, "it works." As Jay noted, their "gut check" tells them that if they can bring some laughter, then they can help speak to the human spirit and strength, improving on some of the odds for the children.
