The Main Event

Speaker- Gregory Rudolph - Hingham Rotary Club-

Greg Rudolph has been a member of the Hingham Rotary Club since 2015. He studied history and religion at Tufts University and attended medical school at the University of Vermont. He spent 10 years working in residential life at Harvard College and currently works there as a pre-medical advisor and a teaching fellow. Greg has been leading medical service trips to the Dominican Republic for over a decade and, in that role, is also the Director of Special Operations at the World Outreach Foundation.

Greg shared with the club the efforts of the Constanza Project in the Dominican Republic. In the city with 120,000 people there are 60,000 in the urban center

They got involved in the DR because there is not much outreach activity there and because it is safer their neighboring Haiti. The Project looks to provide sustainable support in the area of urgent care, primary care and public health through outreach called Operativo. Operativo focuses on screening and preventative care including Identifying and treating vision issues, hypertension and diabetes. Prenatal care is also lacking and this program has also been structured to address proactively. There is no charge to the patients for this care but they are asked to sit through health and nutrition informational sessions. This project established a team that lives their full time to continue on the work via a clinic that visits residents- Casa de Casa (House to House) providing care and Information. Data collection is a component that has been crucial to monitor effectiveness of the program, as well.

Sally Bowles reviewed the Dick Appleton Award and passed out Nomination papers. This award recognizes organizations for outstanding work in their vocation which improves the quality of life and inspires others to do the same.
