The Main Event

ROTARACT CLUB OF THE CAPE COD COMMUNI-TY COLLEGE

With the announcement from **President Tammy** of a financial donation from the Yarmouth Rotary in support of the Rotaract Club at CCCC, she introduced the very-active advisor to Rotaract, Virender Gautam – known to everyone as "Vee Gee." He is on the faculty within the Department of Social Science & Human Service (Economics). Although student members of the Rotaract Club at 4Cs have been occasional visitors over the years to the Yarmouth Rotary (the CCCC Rotaract Club was established in 2001). this was Vee Gee's first visit to the Yarmouth Club, and he thanked **President Tammy** and 4Cs President **Dr. John** Cox (who is also a Hyannis Rotarian) for the larger opportunity.

Vee Gee provided a quick overview of recent Rotaract activities, including the trips to Dubai, India, Washington, D.C., and Haiti (water well project). The Rotaract Club will have a table at the District Conference in April and hopes to attend the RI Conference in South Korea. He introduced six Rotaract members (out of a club membership of 30 to 40 "very engaged" students). They in turn gave voice to their backgrounds, their motivations about college and Rotaract, and their impressions ("awesome"). Dr. Cox concluded with "clean up detail," enlarging upon the college's respect for the students in Rotaract, how active and engaged in the community they are, and summarized, "These students really go places."

The return visit of enthusiastic Guidance Counselor from Cape Cod Tech, Julie Gammon, was the preamble to an upbeat introduction of Rising Star Jody Ann Monroe, an "exceptional student in the Health Technologies program." **Jody** has the most rigorous schedule and gives with her heart, whether it is in volunteering in Meals On Wheels ("smiles and good cheer") or in her academics ("doing extremely well in AP courses and at CCCC"). She doubles up her activities in order to help others – not surprising that she wants to "become a doctor."

Jody Ann noted that she has always wanted to help people. When she volunteers at the Cape Cod Hospital, she has observed the "crinkle in their eye" from those she has helped, followed by her own feelings of "an incredible warm heart." She expressed her thanks to her school, to her Mom, Joyce Monroe, and to God.

GUEST SPEAKER: DR. BRUCE GORDON

Dr. Bruce Gordon, Guru of the Medical Minute, expanded upon his skills as a dispenser of medical education through the deployment of his titled subject, "Personal sanitation, Bugs, and Other Stuff." From the results of using the waters of the earth that are deprived of sanitation (results: bad waterà illness and death) to the work of the father of contemporary epidemiology, Dr. John Snow, the subject of CLEAN WA-TER remains a essential element in the six areas of focus in Rotary International: •2. EDUCATION, •3. MOTHERS and CHILDREN, •4. DIS-EASE, •5. LOCAL ECONOMIES, and •6. PEACE. After all, he noted, "they are all related!"

Dr. Bruce was able to provide photographic and just-plain-graphic illustrations of the sources of water-borne diseases: parasites, bacteria, and viruses. Under the W.A.S.H. program (Water, SAnitation, and Hygiene), the efforts to reduce or remove sickness out of the endless poverty cycle have done much to upgrade the lives of those still living under stressful economic environments.


