The Main Event

Roby Whitehouse introduced our guest speaker – Ryan Chase, the Assistant Wastewater Supervisor for the Town of Yarmouth. Ryan talked about the porous soil on Cape Cod and how that provides a high nutrient quality in the Cape Cod oceans. Chemicals, water runoff and septic system discharge all wind up in our oceans.

That is why the town is in such great need of a water treatment system. The current plan is for an eight-phase plan with each phase taking about 5 years.

New title five regulations require nitrogen reduction sensitive areas. Yarmouth has three nitrogen sensitive watersheds, Lewis Bay, Parker's River and Bass River. The good thing about our Town's sewer plan is that it relieves individual requirements for innovative alternative septic systems. Phasing was developed based on Nitrogen Reduction requirements with Phase 1 creating the backbone of the system.

The following contracts have been awarded for Phase ONE

Contract one – Water treatment plant – awarded to C.H. Nickerson scheduled completion early 2028

Contract two – Robert B. Our - Route 28 and areas north and south of 28

Contract three – Revoli – Route 28 and areas south of 28

Contract four – Robert B. Our - Route 28 and areas north and south of 28, Pump station by Pancake man

Contract five – Dig it Construction - Rt. 28 Higgins Crowell Rd to Parkers River

Contract six – Robert B. Our – Barnstable town line to Higgins Crowell.

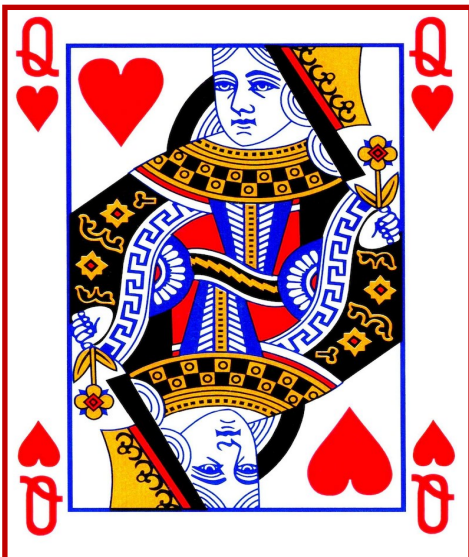

Cape Cod Brite Lights is now five years into our purpose of Helping Cape and Island Residents. We started with weekend nutrition for thirty elementary school children. This has grown to over 60 students who are provided with healthy options for weekend nutrition.

Our next outreach was to provide hygiene for high school students. This grew to include both the Dennis Yarmouth High School and Cape Tech High School and again grew to include two of the elementary schools.

A need for shoes for graduating seniors was identified and we were able to assist. This fall, the need for building blocks, whiteboard markers, glue sticks and binders was identified and again, Cape Cod Brite Lights was able to help. Also identified was a need for Kleenex and disinfection wipes, something teachers had been purchasing with their own funds. Cape Cod Brite Lights was again able to help out.

Additionally, we continue to support the Yarmouth Chamber of Commerce and the Yarmouth Police Department with gift cards to local grocery stores. These help those in need who could just use a little boost.

Crutches for Africa is not a new project to our Rotary Club. We as a club have done collections for this great service and International project twice before. The first time we collected over 700 mobility devices and the second time we collected over 400 mobility devices. We are now hoping to set this up as an ongoing project. Joe Potzka along with members of the International Committee are heading this project up, but we would like all Yarmouth Rotarians to help out. Search for any of the desired items in your home, your extended families homes and your neighbors homes. Round up all of the devices and drop them off at the transfer station where we have a storage trailer to store them. They can be dropped off at the gate house just before you drop off your trash and recyclables. If you need help please give Lou Presiosi a call or send him a text to arrange pickup of your items. All of the items collected will be shipped to Africa to help disabled individuals gain mobility that they never have had.



Items that we are looking to collect include: Leg Braces; Crutches; Forearm Crutches; Walkers; Wheelchairs; Prosthetic Limbs; Baby Joggers and Strollers and Bike Trailers. No Commodes or any other type of Personal Hygiene Equipment.
