The Main Event

GUEST SPEAKER: DAN KNAPIK, YARMOUTH TOWN AD-MINISTRATOR

For Rotary Clubs looking for program subjects or topics, the month of March is designated as "Water and Sanitation Month." For Chuck Carey, Yarmouth Club Chair for Programs and Speakers for March, who better to invite for a first-time appearance than the new Yarmouth Town Administrator, Dan Knapik, on the job for just seven weeks (no doubt, to get his feet wet, so to speak).

The position of Town Administrator is designated as the Chief Executive Officer by the Yarmouth Town Charter, works in conjunction with the Board of Selectmen to implement Town policies and procedures, and is charged with the management of day-to-day operations of Town government. Prior to being interviewed, nominated, and appointed by the Yarmouth Select Board, Dan Knapik was elected Mayor of Westfield, MA, in that city's 2009 municipal election, served three terms to November 2015 (for a grand total of 16 years in city government), and was appointed by Governor Charlie Baker to the position as Director of Green Communities within the state Department of Energy Resources.

Dan outlined aspects of his growing up in Westfield, summering on the Cape, college in Fairfield, CT, and turning to the private sector through a summer job that became more than a 20-year career. All that helped him transition into public service and elective politics in order to contribute to his hometown's growth and financial challenges. Moreover, "facing challenges" seems to be one of his strongest motivations, particularly as he has arrived in Yarmouth. He does not see his effort and style as a singular endeavor, but as a facilitator being on "listening tours," going before a lot of local people, and being an effective crossover to business, government, and community. Not surprising, he extended a hearty invitation to engage with him in identifying the projects that will better the town - before waiting makes them even more expensive.
