Guest Speaker - Kari Parcell - Kari is the Municipal Assistance Coordinator for Barnstable County and Massachusetts DEP. She also represents Dukes and Nantucket county and serves as the point of contact for recycling, composting, reusing, and repurposing. Kari provides technical assistance on waste reduction and recycling to the area. Did you know that the average household in Yarmouth throws out 1,700-2000 pounds of trash annually, not including the recyclables? She spoke of the various towns and efforts to reduce garbage and increase recycling. An important component of this is education, and Kari works with the local municipalities to secure state funding and develop programs to help each town. One example she gave of recycling is "Recolor", which is recycled latex paint that is sold at Habitat for Humanity. No longer do people need to "dry it out, throw it out".
