GUEST SPEAKER: JACQUELINE LANE, NAMI NEW MEMBER: BRIAN SULLIVAN CAPE COD & THE ISLANDS

Guest Speaker Jacqueline Lane is the deeply committed Executive Director of NAMI Cape Cod & the Islands. NAMI is the abbreviation for National Alliance on Mental Health, and Jackie's or ganization is the local affiliate of the national and Massachusetts associations. **Jackie** herself has an extended history of leadership as a volunteer and as a Board member within a number of human service organizations. She has sustained a leadership role in NAMI Cape Cod for five years (even though it is technically a "three-day a week position). Jackie summarized aspects of the structure, the mission, and the local partnerships and support groups of NAMI.

She referenced the strong relationship and correlation between mental health and physical well-being. Their main mission is to help families through • EDUCATION (programming and family-to family groups), ● SUPPORT (groups, personal relationships, and community contacts), and • ADVOCACY (removing the stigma and isolation of mental "illness"). They emphasize and lobby for the models of MENTAL HEALTH within a range of communicative activities, and their programing is free. Jackie touched upon "The Challenging Child," a program of collaborative problem solving, working with families and children "who are being asked to do things that they're not ready for."
