## The Main Event

**Guest Speaker Eileen Elias - No Place for Hate** - Roby, Finbarr and Barry attended the “No Place for Hate” event in Barnstable County which is aligned with Rotary’s Peace and Conflict resolution. “I understand for the month of February, all Rotarians are addressing conflict and resolution. It is a really important topic and Rotarians have touched so many lives and have affected change, no matter what we do and who we are.” Internationally, the impact on children is enormous and a global issue but also on Cape Cod. Eileen and her husband have fostered many children who have been in dire situations and have helped countless children over the years. “When you have a child say to you, at 3 or 4 years of age, say they want to do their life over...the impact is incredible.” She stated that the issue of hate in our schools is huge. Students with disabilities, foreign born individuals, Muslims, and other students are being bullied both physically and verbally. The “No Place for Hate” group now has approximately 20 individuals from many organizations on the Cape to listen and have a plan to successfully help children. Looking the other way doesn’t work. We need to give tools so that students are able to step up and help. “Hate crimes have grossly increased according to the data,” Eileen stated. Her and her husband were in New Delhi last week and visited the memorial for Ghandi, which was miraculous. She stated there was a lot to be learned from his teachings, which were picked up by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

The organization is expecting to have their first bystander training program in April to empower adults and children to be able to not look the other way. The goal is also to promote inter-generational collaboration to overtly address hate and impact change.

Barry closed with speaking regarding the Polio Plus program and international cooperation between Rotary and International governments to allow vaccination. In the history of the program, there were times where conflicts between states were paused to allow for inoculation.

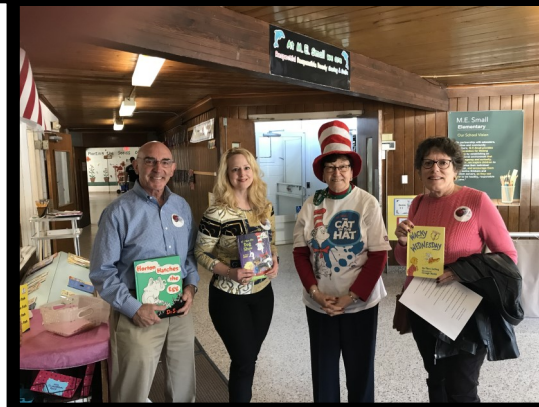
