### Crutches for Africa

**Dennis Robilard** from the Saco Sunset Bay Rotary Club in Maine came down to pick up the mobility devices that we have collected over the past year.

This is at least his sixth time coming to the Cape to collect the items we have collected.

As Dennis stated, we started collecting items in 2016 which was after the 2016 Rotary Convention when Tammy Glivinski had met David Talbot, founder of Crutches for Africa.

The latest collection resulted in us collecting a total of 541 mobility devices. This breaks down into 129 pairs of crutches, 247 walkers, 21 wheelchairs, 69 canes, 14 single arm crutches, 24 rollators, 17 knee scooters and 20 fracture walking boots. Thank you to Mike Riley who helped Joe Potzka pick up items, Howie Onik, Steve Crum and Mike Riley helped clean the wheelchairs and the following who helped load the truck after a recent Friday meeting. Curt Sears, Bill Boyd, Mike Riley, Elizabeth McInnis Joe Potzka and Paul Chatelain. We thank the Town of Yarmouth for donating a storage container on the Transfer Station property for storage and we thank Dennis Robilard for from Maine for volunteering and driving to Yarmouth each time to pick up the items.

## Support Ukrainian Mothers Widowed in the War



With Mother's Day coming up this weekend, co-founders Susan Mathison and Steve Rand visited the latest [Common Man for Ukraine](#) Mothers' Retreat in Zakopane, Poland.

The women who walk through our doors each month during these 10-day [mental health retreats](#) have been through a lot. Each Ukrainian mom has not only lived through a war zone for more than four years, they're also coping with the death of their soldier-husband killed in the war.

A year ago, we began running our [Mothers' Retreats](#) to give these mothers access to coping skills and the opportunity to build relationships with other women going through this unique hardship. The following is translated feedback we received:

“Everyone carries their own story, their pain, and their love.

Everyone learns to live in a new way, look for support in themselves, make steps for children, for life, for themselves.

The path became a little easier thanks to the people who created spaces of care, warmth, and restoration for retreat participants.

Many thanks to the organizers of the retreat—Common Man for Ukraine and Ukraine & Rotary Club Zamość Ordynacki—for their sensitivity, for their warmth, for allowing women around them to breathe more calmly, feel supported, and allow themselves to recover a little.

Thank you for the opportunity to see these women shine their light again.

## Newsletter Fall 2025

Cape Cod Brite Lights is now five years into our purpose of Helping Cape and Island Residents. We started with weekend nutrition for thirty elementary school children. This has grown to over 60 students who are provided with healthy options for weekend nutrition.

Our next outreach was to provide hygiene for high school students. This grew to include both the Dennis Yarmouth High School and Cape Tech High School and again grew to include two of the elementary schools.

A need for shoes for graduating seniors was identified and we were able to assist. This fall, the need for building blocks, whiteboard markers, glue sticks and binders was identified and again, Cape Cod Brite Lights was able to help. Also identified was a need for Kleenex and disinfection wipes, something teachers had been purchasing with their own funds. Cape Cod Brite Lights was again able to help out.

Additionally, we continue to support the Yarmouth Chamber of Commerce and the Yarmouth Police Department with gift cards to local grocery stores. These help those in need who could just use a little boost.

With the holiday season fast approaching, Cape Cod Brite Lights will be assisting the Yarmouth Rotary Club in providing holiday meals for both Thanksgiving and Christmas to families identified by the schools as needing help.

### A Continuous Project by Yarmouth Rotary Club

Crutches for Africa is not a new project to our Rotary Club. We as a club have done collections for this great service and International project twice before. The first time we collected over 700 mobility devices and the second time we collected over 400 mobility devices. We are now hoping to set this up as an ongoing project. Joe Potzka along with members of the International Committee are heading this project up, but we would like all Yarmouth Rotarians to help out. Search for any of the desired items in your home, your extended families homes and your neighbors homes. Round up all of the devices and drop them off at the transfer station where we have a storage trailer to store them. They can be dropped off at the gate house just before you drop off your trash and recyclables. If you need help please give Lou Presiosi a call or send him a text to arrange pickup of your items. All of the items collected will be shipped to Africa to help disabled individuals gain mobility that they never have had.



Items that we are looking to collect include: Leg Braces; Crutches; Forearm Crutches; Walkers; Wheelchairs; Prosthetic Limbs; Baby Joggers and Strollers and Bike Trailers. No Commodes or any other type of Personal Hygiene Equipment.
