PROGRAM - PHIL MORRIS, BOARD OF DIRECTORS CAPE COD COLLABORATIVE



Phil Morris, Chair of the April Program Committee, "introduced" himself as Guest Speaker in his role as a member of the Board of Directors of the Cape Cod Collaborative. Using the previous week's presentation from SMILE Mass (an organization dedicated to providing happy & inclusive memories to families living with children or adults with disabilities) as a

tie-in, **Phil** outlined the role of the Cape Cod Collaborative as a service provider to the Cape & Islands school districts for those children whose special needs education programs present challenges to local public schools.

Formed in 1975 as an interdependent collaboration of public school communities, this Collaborative has become a flexible and evolving source of high quality, cost-effective programs and services. As a D-Y School Committee member, **Phil** serves as D-Y's representative on the Collaborative board. He enumerated some of the Collaborative's programs as well as outlining historical aspects and financial implications of providing special needs educational services.

Members of the Board of Directors do not have access to individual student programs, but do have the oversight responsibilities of policy, budgets, and evaluation of an educational non-profit. **Phil** indicated that he would not know about individual students if it had been for **Tom**

and Sue Tomasik sharing with the Club their experiences in raising their daughter Anna as well as her recent enrollment as a student in the

Collaborative.



The presentation about the Cape Cod Collaborative was given additional credence with **Tom Tomasik's** ad-lib insights about the "astounding change in our little girl in just 6 weeks!" She no longer feels isolated or that she is different – there is everyday structure. 
MICKEY WALKER
