The Main Event

Dick Appleton Vocation Service Award – Steve Albright presented this year's Dick Appleton Vocational Service Award to Ann Bearse of Katelynn's Closet. Katelynn's Closet was established in 2009 as a non-profit that provides needy children on Cape Cod and the Islands, ages 4-18, with clothing, footwear, and basics in order to help them maintain their dignity and foster self-esteem. Katelynn's Closet is named in honor of Katelynn Bearse, who died at age nine and a half while waiting for a heart transplant she nev er received. Every day of Katelynn's life she had to negotiate medical obstacles. She loved clothing and fashion. When Katelvnn looked good, she felt good. It is the mission of Katelynn's Closet that the children served will feel the same way. After Katelynn died, her parents, Ann and Matt, with their son, Tyler, were foster parents to over twenty children. In 2009, they adopted two of them. The logo for Katelynn's Closet, an infinity symbol, is to hon or the homeless four year old girl named Infiniti, who spent her entire life on the streets of Hyannis. This little girl, who has long since been adopted and lives off-Cape, was the reason Katelynn's Closet got its start. When her situation came to the attention of two local sisters, Beth Davis and Susan Johnson, an idea to help local children in need formed. When Ann Bearse joined them, the three, guided by friend, Jeffrey Bilezikian, began Katelynn's Closet.

SafetyNet Tracking Bracelets – Yarmouth Rotary/District 7950 Grant - Yarmouth Police Chief Frank Frederickson addressed the club to thank us all for the donation and matching District 7950 grant to donate 6 SafetyNet Tracking Bracelets to those with family members with cognitive disorders. "This is a proactive approach to put into hands of someone susceptible so we can avoid and prevent the heartache for all involved. It will improve the quality of life in this community and this community came together to put it out there," stated Frederickson. Lieutenant Kevin Lennon stated that with the receivers the YPD has, they are able to pinpoint the person's location within 5 miles to begin to locate and help the person. "Often, these individuals will wander and then eventually sit down, making it difficult to find them, especially with the heavy canopy in the summer and fall," said Kevin. The Rotary Club of Yarmouth and matching District 7950 grant purchase 6 bracelets and a federal grant will provide another 6. The hope is to get these bracelets out to the families that need them. Included in the donation is the 6 bracelets and 4 years of batteries. YPD is the first police department on the Cape to do this, and this, along with the other assets already deployed, will definitely help people in the community.

Habitat for Humanity – Paul Chatelain updated the club on an Inter-Rotary effort of the clubs on Cape Cod to support the local Habitat for Humanity. There will be a build day coming up and the goal is to raise \$100,000 for the local Cape Cod Habitat for Humanity. Paul noted that any donations that go to the local organization stays on Cape Cod. We will be hearing more from Paul in the future, including begging us to shovel concrete!

DY Rising Star - Annette Bowes, a guidance counselor at DY. introduced this month's DY Rising Star, Sawyer Adamaitis. She described him as an upbeat young man who is active in all aspects of DY. From sports, clubs, he volunteers his time to many different groups within the school as well as the community at large. He was recently selected as one of six students to receive scholarship from the Riordin family, where he will receive \$10,000 per year of college, totaling \$40,000. Sawyer stated that initially, he was unsure as to why he was chosen because there were so many other students who were equally deserving. He stated that he loves volunteerism and giving back to the community is his favorite thing to do. Among his goals are to strive for greatness and stay humble.
