

The Main Event

Guest Speakers Dale Fornoff and Lisa Fedy from DY High School – Received designation of New Innovation Pathway from Governor Baker in March. The designation lasts for 5 years and is in health care & social assistance. There are LEAD Applicants of DY and MassHire Cape Cod, and Lead Industry Partners with Coastal Medical Transportation, Cape Cod CPR and the Yarmouth Fire Department.

What are Innovation Pathways? These are the DESE's high quality college & careers pathways initiative, which draws on 3 decades of successful practices and are designed to support schools to enhance a student's ability to gain awareness and preparedness of future employment opportunities and fully prepare academically and make informed choices related to post-secondary pathways in the industry of their interest. They will be bringing on the first cohort in the fall!

Dale and Lisa began looking into this program last March as the pandemic began to impact the area. They had the bones of the program and found ways to enhance the offerings for students in order to leverage this designation with the national healthcare assessment. There is a higher base of learned through AP courses and dual enrollment at 4C's. There is collaboration with MassHire Workforce Board and industry partnerships, including a 100-hour internship in a related field. There is equal access to this, though the number of students are limited to keep the quality of the program high. With this designation, there are grants available, thus the program is free and accessible to all.

Students will walk away from this program with certifications. Dale shared a wonderful testimonial from a mother of a student. The connection of what is happening in the classroom and future opportunities and bridging the gap between the two.



Yarmouth Rotarians joined up at the Cultural Center and other places around town to cheer the Wounded Warrior bike riders on and to thank them for their service.








CAPE COD BRITE LIGHTS

You have heard me mention or talk about the new 501c(3) corporation that was recently started by our Rotary Club. It is named Cape Cod Brite Lights and its mission is to help those in need on Cape Cod. Our main focus to date has been to provide weekend backpacks of nutritional food for needy elementary students in the DY School System. A backpack of food consists of shelf stable milk (white & chocolate), juice carton, cereal, instant oatmeal, two proteins which could be a can of tuna, chicken, pasta, soup or beef stew, a cup of apple sauce, macaroni and cheese, Nutra grain fruit granola bar, cheese its, fruit snacks, pudding cup and 2 pieces of fruit. In addition, to give each student some activities to do during the holiday break we put a coloring book and crayons in each bag. We started with a total of 25 students but have grown to 45, an increase of over 80%.

In addition, to the backpacks we have focused on providing a weekly food bag to clients at Community Connections. These clients are ones that are living on their own but are also struggling to keep their heads above water. About 15 – 18 food items are provided each week to each client to help supplement their food insecurities.

How you can help:

First: Currently we have a board of directors of 11 members. Our bylaws allow us to have a maximum number of 13. If you would like to be a part of our leadership, please contact Steve Albright.

Second: We fill the backpacks and bags of food every Wednesday night at 6:00 PM at the Yarmouth Food Pantry. If you would like to help one or two nights a month, again please contact Steve Albright. Currently we have enlisted the local Girl Scout Troop to help on the first Wednesday of each month and the DY Interact Club to help on the second Wednesday of each month. We are trying to make it a community organization where anybody can be a part of it.

Third: It costs \$150 yearly to support one child's backpack and \$250 yearly to support a weekly food bag. If you would like to financially support a child or a Community Connection client, checks can be mailed to:



The first time we collected over 700 mobility devices and the second time we collected over 400 mobility devices. We are now hoping to set this up as an ongoing project. Mike Riley along with members of the International Committee are heading this project up but we would like all Yarmouth Rotarians to help out. Search for any of the desired items in your home, your extended families homes and your neighbors homes. Round up all of the devices and drop them off at the transfer station where we have a storage trailer to store them. They can be dropped off at the gate house just before you drop off your trash and recyclables. If you need help please give Mike Riley a call or send him a text to arrange pickup of your items. All of the items collected will be shipped to Africa to help disabled individuals gain mobility that they never have had.
