The total first year commitment would be \$1,250.</div> | | <div>International Moment by Jackie Carnevalli - When deciding to sell their business and retire, Giuseppe decided that they wanted to be able to serve the neediest of the needy. The next project may be a mountain school in Nepal. A month ago Jackie was invited to speak at the Women’s Economic Forum. The focus was on sustainability, specifically environmental, economic and social sustainability. The Carnevalli Foundation has had boots on the ground in Hyderabad, India since 2004 and now serves over 1,000 students. They are teaching not only the basics of education, but also life skills so that they are better able to adjust when they go on to being productive members as professionals. There are now 9 graduates of college coming from the school! These students are now giving back by speaking with the children and explaining how their lives have changed by staying in school and finishing the program. Shiva, a graduate of the school, has gone on to pursue his Masters. He has started a company with 7 of his classmates. Carnevalli foundation just hired his company to do project analysis. They are researching installing solar panels on top of the school. Ayah and Reading Class for Adults - she went out and asked people to join them door to door in learning how to read. She recruited mothers from the community to learn to read 2 nights per week. She is now known as the fancy mother in the neighborhood.
