Guest Speaker Amy Brigham – Amy Brigham is a Family Partner at the Cape Cod Family Resource Center. Amy been working with kids for as long as she can remember. Since beginning her career in special education, Amy has worked in various roles supporting families, as well as growing her own family as a foster parent for twenty years. She has continued to grow and expand her knowledge, especially in the areas of Neonatal abstinence syndrome (NAS) and trauma-informed care. NAS is a group of problems that occur in a newborn who was exposed to addictive opiate drugs while in the mother's womb. Amy stated that, "Every mom that gives birth to a baby born addicted lives with guilt for the • rest of their lives." Infants effected by NAS suffer because the central nervous system does not respond normally when in withdrawal. These infants live at the height of adrenaline and are susceptible to overstimulation. She stated that there is not a person in addiction where trauma isn't a part of their lives and it needs to be treated when they are babies. For many years, Amy has ran a trauma daycare through am ARC grant. While the babies are being nurtured, the mothers are also in recovery in parallel. The biggest outcome is attachment and bonding that takes place in a controlled environment. She touted over time, there is a 95% success rate.

"There is a tremendous amount, as much as we are working against the negative view of people in recovery, there is an underlying current of 'why have you done this to your baby?'" The Cape Cod Hospital and support staff have transitioned to looking entirely differently on the mothers and the babies. The hospital has blankets that help with the bonding process, which isn't natural to mothers with low self-esteem. This allows bonding through scent which helps the process. Over time, Amy and her colleagues have found that babies who are being held more are getting through and doing better to be present and physically touching is working.

Now there are also programs for early intervention, which goes into the hospital and introduces what it is all about so they are aware of what will happen when they go home. This helps the mothers and babies transition from the 4-6 weeks of full support in the hospital to going home and having little to no resources. Teaches in home how to calm the mother which helps calm the baby.


