YARMOUTH FOOD PANTRY MOMENT

Barry Clayman announcement: On behalf of the Food Pantry, Sue Martin has received grant from the United Way, related to a Nutrition and Education. This is the first year the full grant of \$20,000 was awarded, and a Key of Thanks was presented to Carol Woodbury for her help and participation in the presentation for the grant. Carol emphasized the schools partnership with the Food Pantry, as over 56% of school lunches are under the Free-and-Reduced category, and over 1400 students are eligible.

Handling the introduction, Ken Sheytanian presented Lisa Mincieli, Director of Adult Education at The Community School of Cape Cod <u>Tech</u>. Lisa's background is in quantitative social science. She received her BA in Sociology from the University of Vermont (2003), and her MPP (Masters of Public Policy) from Georgetown University (2005). In her free time, Lisa enjoys running, yoga, traveling, and spending time with her husband and two young children.
