Founded in 1968 as Nauset Workshop, Cape Abilities has provided over 48 years of service in Barnstable County. The organization has centers in Hyannis and Eastham, and a satellite office in Falmouth. In addition to presenting two videos on Cape Abilities' mission and folks "in action," Glenn was on hand to introduce a new program called Pre-Employment Transition Services (P.E.T.S.). This program has been established to assist 16 to 22 year-old students with disabilities transition from high school into the adult services system by giving qualified candidates an introduction into a work environment, to enhance their vocational choices, to develop positive work habits, and to obtain valuable work experience – all designed to make them more marketable in the competitive workforce.


The evolution of Cape Abilities' role in disability workforce assistance has gone from piecework within a building to much more community based day services and employment transitioning out to local businesses.
