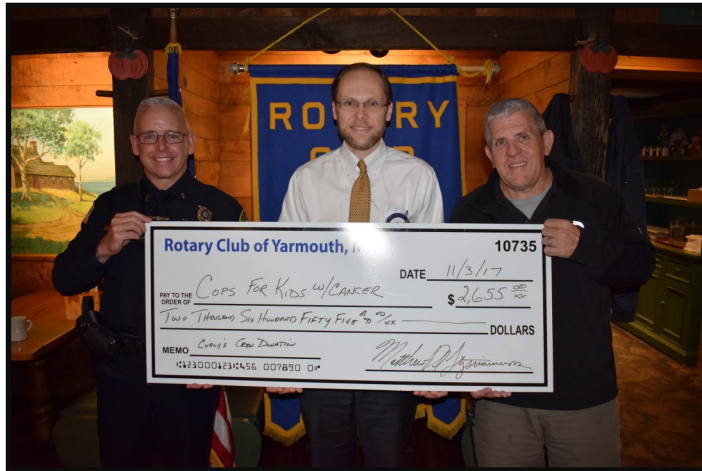

Guest Speaker Joe Ambrosini, Private Investigator

Joe Ambrosini spoke regarding being a Private Investigator. He found this career after a long tenure as a crime scene investigator for Barnstable County Sheriff’s office. He retired in 2008 and became a licensed private investigator. He showed the club the various tools of the trade, including GPS trackers, cameras, and surveillance equipment. He stated that most companies perform background checks for employees, which tells where a person has been, but not where they are going. Ambrosini mentioned how he can pick and choose his cases and never touches a case that he knows anyone involved and testifies. Part of his acumen include being a court certified latent examiner and photographer. He states that private investigative work is not like what is seen on television. The work is tedious, take a long time and cases are not solved within an hour. Investigators must put in their time. He often uses disguises and has even raked a yard across from a house he was investigating to blend in.

He founded the Cape Cod Police K-9 Relief Fund, which provides funding for retired police dogs’ medical bills. The goal is to take the burden off the officers, who generally keep the dogs after
