GUEST SPEAKER: KARA GALVIN, CAPE & ISLANDS WORKFORCE INVESTMENT BOARD

Carol Woodbury introduced Kara Galvin. Director of Youth Services at the Cape & Islands Workforce Investment Board. Prior to joining the Cape & Islands WIB, Kara worked within the Massachusetts One Stop Career Center system as an



Operational Manager at CareerWorks (Brockton), as a Business Service Manager (Boston Career Link), and as a regional trainer. **Kara** has developed extensive experience working with hard-to-serve populations: dislocated workers, veterans, economically disadvantaged adults, youth, individuals with disabilities, and ex-offenders. Prior to these employment service positions, **Kara** (a Northeastern University graduate), worked as a corporate recruiter for Adecco Employment Services, managing major corporate clients, in addition to several years at Ann Taylor Loft.

The Cape and Islands Workforce Investment Board (C&I WIB) is a regional, private sector led agency responsible for overseeing all publicly funded vocational education and training programs serving the entire Cape and Islands. It is organized as a private non-profit 501(c) 3 corporation, formed to carry out the mandates of the federal Workforce Investment Act of 1998 and to provide leadership for workforce development activities through private and public partnerships. One of those activities is Career Opportunities, the Cape & Islands' Local One Stop Career Center located in Hyannis; and serving youth (ages 14 – 21), adults, and those 55-and-over who are seeking employment.



In addition to outlining key points about the WIB, **Kara** provided information on the more youth oriented endeavors such as the Art Works Program, the new residential Construction Career Day, the first Leadership Academy at Heritage, the Connecting Activities Program, and the Work-based Learning Plans. This includes internship programs with Dennis-Yarmouth Regional High School under the <u>Cape & Islands School to Careers Partnership</u>.

School to Careers is based on the premise that education works best when students can connect their academics to the world of work, their future careers, and their daily lives. On-the-job experiences allow students to explore potential careers, to think about their future educational goals, and to develop skills necessary for success in the workplace; it brings relevance to academic subjects.
