GUEST SPEAKER: DR. ELIZABETH STEVENSON, MAS-SACHUSETTS MARITIME ACADEMY

Paul Tardif introduced and "welcomed home" Guest Speaker, Dr. Elizabeth Stevenson, Vice President of Enrollment Management at the Massachusetts Maritime Academy in Buzzards Bay. She has held a number of positions at MMA, including the Associate Director of Admissions Marketing and the Assistant Director of Admissions. She also has a background in Human Resources and Recruitment. She holds • a MMA degree in Marine Safety Environmental Protections, • a Master's of Science in Facilities Management from the Academy, and • a doctorate in Law and Policy from Northeastern University. As Paul noted, "Most importantly, she is a 1993 graduate of Dennis -Yarmouth Regional High School."

Elizabeth outlined aspects of her own experiences at MMA intertwined with examples of the school's growth (enrollment up from 900 to 1500 in ten years), successes (seven majors now offered, five in engineering), and student leadership connected with teamwork, courage and confidence. 


RISING STAR: CHARMAGNE FLAMMOND FROM CAPE COD TECH
